REQUIREMENTS:

Each 4-H member should meet general requirements to complete a project.

- ✿ Complete at least six learning experiences related to your project.
- ✿ Make a set of project goals.
- ✿ Each month you should complete at least one of your project goals.
- ✿ Exhibit your project work.
- ✿ Attend workshops that are available in your community or county on your particular project.
- ✿ Attend 4-H meetings or project meetings regularly.
- ✿ Complete 4-H project records each year.
- ✿ Develop leadership by teaching others something about your project.
- ✿ Conduct citizenship activities related to your 4-H project.
- ✿ Find new and fun things to do in your project area.

A standard 4-H or FFA record must be kept on the project and presented by 4:00 p.m. on **Friday, September 8, 2023**. If a record is not available, this disqualifies the animal from the show. Plaques for "Best Set of Records" on steers, market hogs, and lambs will be given. A complete record must contain the following: (1) standard record form (2) written story on the development of the animal and (3) a picture story showing the development of the animal.
